Snowball Activity

The Snowball Toss is a great way to open discussions around mental health, compassion, understanding and supporting others

- 1. Ask your students to choose one of the causes of bullying *(previous slide)* or one they feel strongly about that isn't listed.
- 2. Write it down on a piece of paper and scrunch it into a ball. Then have them throw it into a container at the front of the class.

This is an anonymous activity

3. Once all snowballs are in, open them up one at a time and read them to the class. Ask the students what they notice? Any surprises? Was there a cause that was chosen more than the others? How do they relate to each other?

You can do this in a class talking circle or in pairs


